Professor Anastasia Gage (Ghana, USA): Professor Gage is a professor at the Department of Global Community Health and Behavioral Sciences, School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine, at Tulane University in New Orleans, USA. In addition, she is a member of the Strategic Advisory Board on Economic and Social Affairs. She earned a doctor of philosophy degree in Demography from the University of Pennsylvania, a Master of philosophy degree in Population Studies from the University of Ghana, and a Bachelor of Arts (Honors) degree in Geography from the University of Sierra Leone. Dr. Gage has extensive research experience in sexual and reproductive health, violence against women and girls, maternal and child health, women's empowerment, and health risk behaviors among youth. She has also conducted qualitative and quantitative studies to support program design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation in Ghana, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Haiti, Nigeria, Jamaica, Uganda, and Zambia. Dr. Gage has served on the Board of Directors of the African Population and Health Research Center, the Integrated Public Use Microdata Series (IPUMS) International, Advisory Board for the National Science Foundation, the Scientific Advisory Committee, the Global Health Network, and the International Outreach Committee, Population Association of America (PA). She served as President of the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population, the worldwide network of demographers, from 2015-2017.

(r) Elliott Harris has served since 2015 as Assistant Secretary General for Economic Development and Chief Economist in the Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA). Mr. Harris has more than 40 years of international experience in the fields of international economics and development policy analysis, coupled with knowledge of the United Nations system, multilateral and inter-agency coordination processes. He has extensive experience in the design of macroeconomic policies and its application as a central instrument for the reduction of poverty and for resilient and sustained economic development. His work in the field of economics also focuses on the macroeconomic linkages with global social and environmental policies. Since 2011, Mr. Harris has served as Assistant Secretary General and Head of the New York Office of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP). He joined UNEP's Senior Management Team in 2013 as Director of the New York Office and Secretary to the Environment Management Group. Prior to joining UNEP, Mr. Harris began his career in the International Monetary Fund (IMF) in 1975, where he worked in the African Department and the Fiscal Affairs Department.
