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#### INTRODUCTION

In 1994, Member States at the United Nations International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD)<sup>1</sup> in Cairo agreed that "population-related goals and policies are integral parts of cultural, economic and social development". Today, even more than in the past, population issues are at the forefront of policy debates. In many countries, demographic concerns are shaping policy decisions on pensions and social security, health care, international and internal migration and the environment. Population issues are also at the core of the internationally agreed development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals.<sup>2</sup> Given the emphasis placed by the international community on the achievement of such goals, it is important to assess and monitor the actions taken by Governments towards including population issues in their national development strategies.

As in previous United Nations Inquiries, the purpose of the United Nations Tenth Inquiry among Governments on Population and Development is to assist the United Nations in the collection and dissemination of information on national population policies.<sup>3</sup> Governments are encouraged to discuss their views and policies on population issues in light of the internationally agreed development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals. This will be especially important given that in 2009, the United Nations Commission on Population and Development will focus on the contribution of the Programme of Action of the ICPD to the internationally agreed development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals.
