1. Following the fruitful discussion on the current work of the Commission in Cluster I, my delegation wishes to share its views on Chapters VI, VIII and X of the H.C. Report which have been discussed in Cluster II.

Mr. Chair,

7. Turning now to the topic “**Immunity of State officials from foreign criminal jurisdiction**”, my delegation wishes to commend the Special Rapporteur, Madame Concepción Escobar Hernández for her seventh report on the remaining procedural aspects of immunity

8. Thailand wishes to once again stress the need to strike the right balance

withdraw from such an agreement. In principle, and in line with Article 62 (2) of VCLT, we are of the view that existing entitlements should be upheld in order to maintain peace, stability and friendly relations among nations – therefore

a fundamental change of circumstances should not be invoked in relation to maritime boundaries. The rights of Member States in relation to maritime zones and boundaries guaranteed by UNCLOS must be protected.

13. It is also important for the Commission to take into consideration the progress of the work of other relevant fora on the law of the sea to ensure consistency and complementarities between various tracks.
