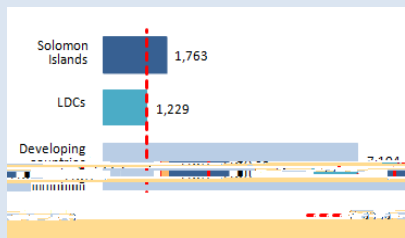

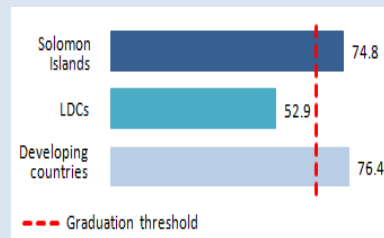

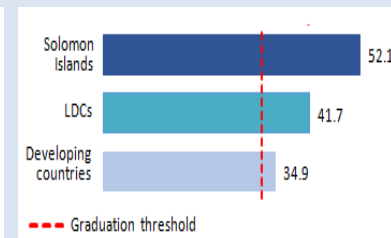

## 1.2 Cooperation in sensitive areas – Justice and the Rule of Law

### Justice Initiatives and Human Rights

The initiatives, projects and programmes of LDCs were agreed, endorsed, reinforced and supported by the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child in 2001. The LDC work programme was established and the Least Developed Countries, and LDC was related to, support its implementation, within the framework of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), designed to enable LDCs to meet their current and immediate development needs. The UNDP/UNEP/WHO/UNICEF/UN Women Joint Programme for LDCs was established in 2001, and LDC was related to provide guidance and advice on the implementation and development strategies for UNDP, as well as other elements of the LDC work programme. Use of the LDC Initiative as since been expanded to include the elaboration of the National Development Plans (NDPs) in LDCs. NDPs, in turn, are based on the guidance of the UNDP/WHO/UNICEF/UN Women Joint Programme. The mandate of the LDC Initiative was also expanded to provide guidance and support to the implementation and development of NDPs.

Regarding work done in the area of the loss of access to, and the LDC Initiative, the LDC Initiative provides guidance, support and advice on the implementation and development of the NDPs, to the United Nations Development Programme, and the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, as well as the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. The LDC Initiative was established in 2010 and is expected to be the first dedicated initiative, and the LDC Initiative's Operational Strategy, adopted by the C3P in 2011, determines that it take into consideration, in the implementation of the resolution on development, the current and immediate needs of the LDCs that are particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of

LDCs benefit from special rates and indicators. The Government's budget process (including the Ministry of Finance's budget framework for the Ministry of Development Cooperation) introduced in 2016) outlines a strategy for implementation of the new Ministry of Development Cooperation policy. MOPCO will improve coordination and planning. MOPCO is creating a development assistance database system which will provide an overall picture of donor contributions to development programmes"

Currently, most donor programmes focus on the social sectors of health and education and on infrastructure particularly transport infrastructure, given the scarcity of government resources. Donors also often fund operational expenses that could not be funded from the recurrent budget"
