In Liberia, the Commission has advocated strongly for an inclusive reconciliation process. The Statement of Mutual Commitments which the Commission concluded with the Government of Liberia in November 2010 highlighted inclusive reconciliation as a priority. On this basis,

The Commission has drawn the attention to the possible political implications of the Ebola epidemic in Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone, as the disease has threatened to erode social cohesion and undermine the functioning of key state institutions.
