Statement by the Outgoing Chair of the Peacebuilding Commission

Excellencies and distinguished colleagues,

We finally meet to wrap up the eighth session and inaugurate the ninth session of the Peacebuilding Commission. I congratulate all newly elected and selected members of the Committee. I trust you would all agree that the delay in convening to design caused by the inexplicable delay in the election process serves as a reminder that after ten years from its inception, the innovative election process associated with the Peacebuilding Commission continues to challenge many of us in regional groups and in the Secretariat.

A year ago, this Committee has entrusted Brazil with the responsibility to lead the work of the Peacebuilding Commission. Today, I wish to thank you all for the trust placed in Braz and for the support you offered throughout the year.

While it remains a tall order to accompany countries emerging from conflict as they take confident strides on what we would all hope to see as irreversible path to peace, stability and development, it is truly rewarding to be associated with such an effort.
