and rule of law issues in all their activities, including country visits, thematic meetings, technical assistance recommendations, and other interactions with Member States.

The Security Council, in its resolution <u>1624 (2005)</u>, addresses incitement to commit terrorist acts and stresses that States must ensure that any measures they take to implement the resolution comply with all their obligations under international law, including international human rights law. In the preamble, the relevance of the right to freedom of expression to counter-incitement measures is highlighted, among others.

In its resolution <u>2617 (2021)</u> renewing the mandate of CTED, the Council reminds States that effective measures to counter terrorism and violent extremism as and when conducive to terrorism, and respect for human rights are complementary and mutually reinforcing and essential to success.
