As was observed in the original volume, the Repertoire is not intended as a substitute for the records of the Council, which constitute the only comprehensive and authoritative account of its deliberations. The Council is at all times, within the framework of the Charter of the United Nations, "master of its own procedure". The object of the Repertoire will have been achieved if readers, by using the descriptive titles of the headings under which the material is presented, are enabled to find relevant proceedings in order to draw conclusions for themselves concerning the practice of the Council.
