The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF JULY 2011

AFRICA

Central African Republic – BINUCA

S/PRST/2001/25 of 26 September 2001

Last para.: requests the Secretary-General to continue to keep the Security Council <u>regularly informed</u> on the situation in the Central African Republic.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 16 May 2011 (S/2011/311) is before the Security Council.

Côte d'Ivoire – UNOCI

Resolution 1981 (2011) of 13 May 2011

Para. 2: requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Security Council the final report referred to in paragraphs 18 and 19 of resolution 1962 (2010), including the findings and recommendations on the mandate of the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (UNOCI) following the assessment mission deployed to Côte d'Ivoire, no later than 30 June 2011.

Para. 5: requests the Secretary-General, further to paragraph 6 of resolution 1980 (2011), to keep the Security Council informed <u>by 30 June 2011</u> in the final report referred to in paragraph 2 of this resolution of developments, measures taken and efforts made in the coordination of UNOCI and the United Nations Mission in Liberia (UNMIL) to assist respectively the Governments of Côte d'Ivoire and Liberia in monitoring their border and surrounding areas, including on how the redeployed assets are assisting in this effort, with particular attention to any cross border movement of combatants or transfer of arms.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 24 June 2011 (S/2011/387) is before the Security Council.

Para. 1: decides to extend <u>until 31 July 2011</u> the UNOCI mandate as set out in resolutions 1975 (2011), 1962 (2010) and 1933 (2010).

The UNOCI mandate will expire on 31 July 2011.

A meeting between the Security Council and the troop- and police-contributing countries will take place prior to the expiration of the UNOCI mandate.

Great Lakes region (LRA)

S/PRST/2008/48 of 22 December 2008

The Security Council reiterates its deep concern at the long-running and brutal insurgency by the Lord's Resistance Army (LRA) which has caused the death, abduction and displacement of thousands of innocent civilians in Uganda, the Sudan and the Democratic Republic of the Congo; welcomes the joint efforts the States in the region have made to address the security threat posed by the LRA; and states that it will continue to monitor the situation closely.

Libyan Arab Jamahiriya

Resolution 1973 (2011) of 17 March 2011

Para 12: requests the Secretary-General to inform the Council immediately of any actions taken by the Member States concerned in exercise of the authority conferred by paragraph 8 of this resolution and to report to the Security Council within 7 days and <u>every month</u> thereafter on the implementation of this resolution, including information on any violations of the flight ban imposed by paragraph 6.

The Secretary-General is expected to brief the Security Council during July 2011.

Somalia / Eritrea – sanctions

Resolution 1844 (2008) of 20 November 2008

Para. 11(g): decides that the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolutions 751 (1992) and 1907 (2009) shall report at least <u>every 120 days</u> to the Council on its work and on the implementation of resolution 1844 (2008), with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraphs 1, 3 and 7 of this resolution.

The Chairman of the 751/1907 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council <u>during</u> <u>July 2011</u>.

Somalia – Monitoring Group

Resolution 1916 (2010) of 19 March 2010

Para. 6: decides to extend the mandate of the Monitoring Group referred to in paragraph 3 of resolution 1558 (2004), and requests the Secretary-General to take the necessary administrative measures as expeditiously as possible to re-establish the Monitoring Group for a period of 12 months.

The mandate of the Monitoring Group will expire on 31 July 2011.

Para. 6(k): decides that the Monitoring Group will submit, for the Security Council's consideration, through the Committee pursuant to resolutions 751 (1992) and 1907 (2009), a final report covering all the tasks set out in paragraph 6 of this resolution no later than 15 days prior to the termination of the Monitoring Group's mandate.

The report of the Monitoring Group is expected to be submitted by 16 July 2011.

The Sudan - UNMIS

Resolution 1979 (2011) of 27 April 2011

Para.1: decides to extend <u>until 9 July 2011</u> the mandate of the United Nations Mission in the Sudan (UNMIS) as set out in resolution 1590 (2005).

The UNMIS mandate will expire on 9 July 2011.

Para. 3: requests the Secretary-General to continue to consult with the parties to the Comprehensive Peace Agreement (CPA) in this regard and submit a report by 16 May 2011

The report of the Secretary-General dated 17 May 2011 (S/2011/314) is before the Security Council.

Report of the Secretary-General S/2011/314

In para 80.the Secretary-General urges the parties and the Security Council to consider <u>a three-month</u> technical rollover of UNMIS <u>from 9 July to 9 October</u>. During this period UNMIS will commence the downsizing of its presence in Khartoum while focusing on assisting the parties to maintain calm while seeking resolutions to the residual Comprehensive Peace Agreement and post-referendum issues.

Resolution 1979 (2011) of 27 April 2011

Para. 2: announces the intent of the Security Council to establish a mission to succeed UNMIS.

Report of the Secretary-General S/2011/314

In para 41 the Secretary-General recommends that the Security Council consider the establishment, under Chapter VI of the Charter of the United Nations, of a multidimensional United Nations operation, the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS). The mission's main tasks would include good offices and political support for peace consolidation; Support to security sector reform and the rule of law; Security aspects, including conflict mitigation and physical protection of civilians

The Sudan – UNAMID

Resolution 1935 (2010) of 30 July 2010

Para. 8: requests the Secretary-General to continue reporting to the Security Council every 90 days on progress made towards implementing the mandate of the African Union-United Nations Hybrid Operation in Darfur (UNAMID) across Darfur, including on progress towards and obstacles to the implementation of the strategy referred to in paragraph 4 of this resolution, also including an assessment of progress against the benchmarks set out in Annex II of the report of the Secretary-General of 16 November 2009 as well as on progress on the political process, the security and humanitarian situation, including in the IDP sites and refugee camps, and early recovery and all parties compliance with their international obligations.

Para. 20: requests the Secretary-General periodically to review and update the concept of operations and rules of engagement of UNAMID in line with the mission's mandate under relevant Security Council resolutions and to report, as part of the reports referred to in paragraph 8 above, on this to the Security Council and troop-contributing countries.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by mid-July 2011.

Para. 1: decides to extend the mandate of UNAMID for a further 12 months to 31 July 2011.

The UNAMID mandate will expire on 31 July 2011.

A meeting between the Security Council and the troop- and police-contributing countries will take place prior to the expiration of the UNAMID mandate.

The Sudan - UNISFA

Resolution 1990 (2011) of 27 June 2011

Para 11: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed of the progress in implementing the Comprehensive Peace Agreement by and to report to the Council no later than thirty days after the adoption of this resolution and every 60 days thereafter.

Para 12: decides to review the role of the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA) in the implementation of the Agreement not later than <u>3 months</u> after adoption of this resolution:

United Nations Office for West Africa (UNOWA)

<u>Letter from the President of the Security Council dated 20 December 2010 (S/2010/661)</u>
Requests that the Secretary-General report to the Security Council <u>every 6 months</u> on the fulfilment by the United Nations Office for West Africa (UNOWA) of its revised mandate.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued during July 2011.

Para. 5: expresses its intention to review the mandate of UNAMI in 12 months or sooner, if requested by the Government of Iraq.

The mandate of UNAMI is expected to be reviewed during July 2011.

Para. 1: decides to extend the UNAMI mandate until 31 July 2011.

The UNAMI mandate will expire on 31 July 2011.

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian Question

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

Middle East – Lebanon (resolution 1701 (2006))

Resolution 1937 (2010) of 30 August 2010

Para. 10: requests the Secretary-General to continue to report to the Security Council on the implementation of resolution 1701 (2006) every 4 months, or at any time as he deems appropriate.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 6 June 2011 (S/2011/359) is before the Security Council.

UN Regional Centre for Preventive Diplomacy in Central Asia

Letter from the President of the Security Council dated 15 May 2007 (S/2007/280)

Invites the Secretary-General to inform members of the Security Council about the activities of the United Nations Regional Centre for Preventive Diplomacy in Ashgabat and its impact on the ground.

The Security Council is expected to receive an update <u>during July 2011</u>.

EUROPE

Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) – UNMIK Resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999

Para. 20: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council <u>at regular intervals</u> on the implementation of the resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 31 July 2011.
