This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

Somalia: Sanctions - 751/1907 Committee to publish implementation assistance notice Resolution 2244 (2015) of 23 October 2015

Para.4: Requests the Committee, <u>within 90 days</u> of adoption of this resolution, to publish an implementation assistance notice summarising the arms embargo restrictions in place for Somalia and Eritrea, as well as outlining exemptions to the arms embargo;

The implementation assistance notice is expected to be published in January 2016.

South Sudan: SG plan for UNMISS to deter and respond to escalation of violence in Juba Resolution 2252 (2015) of 15 December 2015

UNOWA: SG reports

Resolution 2210 (2015) of 16 March 2015

Para.47: Requests that the Secretary-General reports to the Council every three months on developments in Afghanistan, and to include in his reports an evaluation of progress made against the benchmarks for measuring and tracking progress in the implementation of UNAMA's mandate, including at the subnational level, and priorities as set out in this resolution;

Iraq: SG reports on UNAMI

Resolution 2233 (2015) of 29 July 2015

Para.7: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council <u>every three months</u> on the progress made towards the fulfilment of all UNAMI's responsibilities;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in January 2016.

Iraq/Kuwait: missing persons and return of property

Resolution 2107 (2013) of 27 June 2013

Para.4: requests that the Special Representative of the Secretary General and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission to Iraq (UNAMI) promote, support and facilitate efforts regarding the repatriation or return of all Kuwaiti and third country nationals or their remains, and the return of Kuwaiti property, including the national archives, seized by Iraq, further requests the Secretary-General to report separately to the Security Council on these matters in his reports on the progress made towards the fulfilment of all UNAMI's responsibilities;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in January 2016.

Iraq: SG reports on UN compensation fund

Resolution 1956 (2010) of 15 December 2010

Para.6: Requests the Secretary-General to provide written reports on an ongoing basis to the council every six months, with the first report due no later than 1 January 2012, about the United Nations compensation fund, evaluating the continued compliance with the provisions of paragraph 21 of resolution 1483 (2003).

The report of the Secretary-General dated 7 December 2015 (S/2015/937) is before the Security Council.

Middle East (Syria): Authorization of use of border crossings for humanitarian assistance and monitoring mechanism

Resolution 2191 (2014) of 17 December 2014

Para.2: Decides to renew the decisions in paragraphs two and three of Security Council

Middle East (Syria): SG report on options for a ceasefire monitoring, verification, reporting mechanism and options for confidence building measures

Resolution 2254 (2015) of 18 December 2015

Para.7: Emphasizes the need for a ceasefire monitoring, verification and reporting mechanism, requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on options for such a mechanism that it can support, as soon as possible and no later than one month after the adoption of this resolution, and encourages Member States, including members of the Security Council, to provide assistance, including through expertise and in-kind contributions, to support such a mechanism;

Para.11: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council, as soon as possible and no later than one month after the adoption of this resolution, on options for further confidence building measures;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in January 2016.

PBC Organizational Committee: election of two E-10 members

Resolution 1947 (2010) of 29 October 2010

Para.5: Calls for a further comprehensive review five years after the adoption of the present resolution following the procedure as set out in paragraph 27 of resolution 1645 (2005).

PSC and PGA letter of 15 December 2014 (S/2014/911)

Sixth para: The second stage, consisting of nominating two co-facilitators for intergovernmental consultations which will conclude by submitting an outcome to the General Assembly and the Security Council for consideration and appropriate action, should be completed by the end of <u>December 2015</u>.

Resolution 1645 (2005) of 20 December 2005

Para.6: Decides that members of the Organizational Committee shall serve for renewable terms of two years, as applicable.

The Security Council is expected to announce by <u>January 2016</u> the two members elected to serve on the PBC Organizational Committee.

Terrorism/Cross-border crime: SG report on UN efforts to address the threat of terrorists benefitting from transnational organized crime in affected regions

Resolution 2195 (2014) of 19 December 2014

Para.20: Requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Council a report on the efforts of the United Nations entities to address the threat of terrorists benefiting from transnational organized crime in affected regions, including Africa, with respect to matters with which the Council is seized, with input from the relevant entities of the United Nations system including the UNODC, CTED, the Analytical Support and Sanctions Monitoring Team, and other relevant CTITF entities;

Para.21: Further requests that the report include recommendations of concrete options for strengthening Member States' capabilities, including financing such proposed UN projects and activities to build capacity with existing resources and contributions in the UN system, as well as UN activities to reduce the negative impacts of terrorists benefiting from transnational organized crime including those relevant to its conflict resolution efforts with a focus on border security, counter-terrorist financing, and anti-money-laundering, and that the report be submitted to the Council no later than six months from the adoption of this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 21 May 2015 (S/2015/366) is before the Security Council.
