**TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE
SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH 2016**

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AFRICA

Para.15: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of this resolution at least every 60 days;

The report of the Secretary General dated 25 February (S/2016/182) is before the Security Council.

Libya: Sanctions: SC review of Panel of Experts mandate

Resolution 2213 (2015) of 27 March 2015

Para.24: Decides to extend until 30 April 2016 the mandate of the Panel of Experts, established by paragraph 24 of resolution 1973 (2011) and modified by resolutions 2040 (2012) 2146 (2014) and 2174 (2014), expresses its intent to review the mandate and take appropriate action regarding further extension no later than twelve months from the adoption of this resolution, and decides that the Panel shall carry out the following tasks:

Mali: SG reports on MINUSMA, focusing on progress in the implementation of the Agreement on it

Resolution 2227 (2015) of 29 June 2015

Para.35: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every three months after the adoption of this resolution on the implementation of this resolution, focusing on the progress in the implement support it;

Mali: Report by France on implementation of mandate to support MINUSMA

Resolution 2227 (2015) of 29 June 2015

Para.27: Authorizes French forces, within the limits of their capacities and areas of deployment, to use in support of elements of MINUSMA when under imminent and serious threat upon request of the Secretary-General, and requests France to report to the Council on the implementation of this mandate in Mali and to coordinate its reporting with the reporting by the Secretary-General referred to in paragraph 35 below;

Somalia: UNSOM mandate

Resolution 2232 (2015) of 28 July 2015

Sudan: SG reports on UNAMID

Resolution 2228 (2015) of 29 June 2015

Para.28: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every 90 days following adoption of this resolution on UNAMID, including:

- (i) information on the political, humanitarian and security situation in Darfur, including detailed reporting on incidents of violence and attacks against civilians, by whomsoever perpetrated;
- (ii) information on violations of the Status of Forces Agreement, including those involving attacks or threats of attack on UNAMID, as well as violations of international humanitarian law perpetrated by any party to the conflict;
- (iii) developments and progress;
- (iv) developments and progress in addressing the challenges facing UNAMID as identified in the review of UNAMID;
- (v) and on the implementation of this resolution;

The report of the Secretary General is expected to be issued in March 2016.

AMERICAS

Colombia: SG recommendations on size, operational aspects and mandate of Mission

Para.3: Requests the Secretary-General to initiate preparations now, including on the ground, and to present detailed recommendations to the Security Council for its consideration and approval regarding the size and operational aspects and mandate of the Mission, consistent with the Joint Communiqué, as soon as possible and then within 30 days of the signature of the ceasefire agreement by the Government of Colombia and the FARC-EP, in light of its provisions;

Haiti: SG reports on MINUSTAH

Para.33: Requests the Secretary-General to keep it regularly informed, and to report to the Council on

Para.3: Decides to extend until 17 March 2016 the mandate of UNAMA, as defined in its resolutions 1662 (2006), 1746 (2007), 1806 (2008), 1868 (2009), 1917 (2010), 1974 (2011), 2041 (2012), 2096 (2013) and 2145 (2014), and paragraphs 4, 5, 6 and 7 below;

The mandate of UNAMA will expire on 17 March 2016.

Iraq: SG reports on escrow account (oil for food termination)

Para.8: Requests the Secretary-General to report and provide analysis to the Council on the usage and expenditure of the escrow account referenced in paragraphs 4 and 5 on an annual basis, the first no later than 31 March 2012, with the final report occurring three months after the transfer of any remaining funds retained for the purposes of paragraphs 4 and 5 to the Government of Iraq by 31 December 2016, unless otherwise authorized by the Security Council.

Middle East (Lebanon/UNIFIL): SG reports on implementation of resolution 1701 (2006)

Para.12: Requests the Secretary-General to continue to report to the Council on the implementation of resolution 1701 (2006), every four months, or at any time as he deems appropriate;

Middle East (Syria): Joint Investigative Mechanism reports

Resolution 2235 (2015) of 7 August 2015

Para.11: Requests the Joint Investigative Mechanism to complete its first report within 90 days of the date on which it commences its full operations, as notified by the United Nations Secretary-General, and complete subsequent reports as appropriate thereafter and requests the Joint Investigative Mechanism to present the report, or reports, to the United Nations Security Council and inform the OPCW Executive Council;

Para.20: Requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Council a report on the efforts of the United Nations entities to address the threat of terrorists benefitting from transnational organized crime in affected regions, including Africa, with respect to matters with which the Council is seized, with input from the relevant entities of the United Nations system including the UNODC, CTED, the Analytical Support and Sanctions Monitoring Team, and other relevant CTITF entities;

Para.21: Further requests that the report include recommendations of concrete options for

to build capacity with existing resources and contributions in the UN system, as well as UN activities to reduce the negative impacts of terrorists benefitting from transnational organized crime including those relevant to its conflict resolution efforts with a focus on border security, counter-terrorist financing, and anti-money-laundering, and that the report be submitted to the Council no later than six months from the adoption of this resolution;
