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Resolution 2017(2) of July 2017

"The Secretary-General is requested to report to the Security Council on the situation in Burundi every three months after the adoption of this

Resolution 2276 (2017) of 23 December 2017

Paragraph 1 requests the Secretary-General to prepare a report for the Security Council within 90 days of the adoption of this resolution that sets out a well-developed peacebuilding plan to direct the role of the United Nations system and other relevant partners, including multilateral and bilateral actors, in supporting Liberia's transition, emphasizes in this regard the important convening role of the Peacebuilding Commission in the process of developing this plan, further requests that UN 1279 work closely with the United Nations Country Team (UNCT) and its component United Nations agencies to implement the results of the UNCT's mapping exercise to identify ways to address gaps in capabilities to accelerate preparations for UN 1279's drawdown and closure, in particular the transfer of UN 1279's tasks on human rights monitoring, rule of law, national reconciliation and security sector reform to the government and the UNCT to ensure continued progress in those areas, urges the Government of Liberia, UN 1279 and the UNCT to coordinate closely in the transfer of these responsibilities, and encourages the international community and donors to support the activities of the UNCT in assisting Liberia's continued efforts to achieve sustainable peace.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in March 2017.

Resolution 2276 (2017) of 23 March 2017

Paragraph 1 extends UN 1279's mandate as set out in paragraph 1 of resolution 2160 (2014) until 23 March 2017.

Resolution 2827 (2015) of 18 December 2015

Paragraph 18 requests that the Secretary-General provide detailed information within 90 days on force generation, restructuring of the 127<sup>th</sup> force, logistical support and enablers, and civilian personnel to implement the mandate, as well as whether the T. 21 has maintained its consent in principle to deployment of the UN F and not imposed any political or operational impediments to operationalizing the UN F or obstructed 127<sup>th</sup> in the performance of its mandate, and relevant information.



Resolution 2274 (2017) of 16 March 2017

Article 4 decides to extend until 17 March 2017 the mandate of 12B7B0 as defined in its resolutions 1 (2000), 174 (2007), 150 (2008), 151 (2008), 171 (2010), 174 (2011), 2041 (2012), 2050 (2013), 2146 (2014) and 2210 (2016) and paragraphs 4, 6 (and 7 below)

The mandate will expire on 17 March 2017
