AFRICA

CAR: Sanctions: Panel of Experts reports
Resolution 2399 (2018) of 30 January 2018

Para.32 (c): Provide to the Security Council, after discussion with the Committee, a midterm report no later than 30 July 2018, and a final report by 31 December 2018, on the implementation of the measures imposed by paragraphs 54 and 55 of resolution 2127 (2013) and paragraphs 30 and 32 of resolution 2134 (2014) renewed by paragraphs 1, 2, 9 and 16 of this resolution;

The midterm report of the PoE is expected to be provided no later than 30 July 2018.

CAR: Sanctions: Secretariat to provide benchmarks to assess arms embargo measures
Resolution 2399 (2018) of 30 January 2018

Somalia: AMISOM mandate
Resolution 2415 (2018) of 15 May 2018

South Sudan: Sanctions: Travel ban and assets freeze

Para. 1: Decides to renew until 15 July 2018 the measures imposed by paragraphs 9 and 12 of resolution 2206 (2015), and reaffirms the provisions of paragraphs 10, 11, 13, 14 and 15 of resolution 2206 (2015), and the provisions of paragraphs 8, 9 and 10 of resolution 2290 (2016);

The travel ban and assets freeze will expire on 15 July 2018.

Second para: The members of the Security Council concur with the recommendation contained in your second report on UNOWAS (S/2016/1072) to extend its mandate, as set forth in the annex to this letter, for a further period of three years, from 1 January 2017 to 31 December 2019. The members of the Council request that you report to the Council every six months on the fulfilment by UNOWAS of its mandate.
