The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

AFRICA

CAR: SG reports on the situation in CAR and MINUSCA

Resolution 2552 (2020) of 12 November 2020

Para. 54: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on 15 February 2021, 15 June 2021 and 11 October 2021, including on: the situation in the CAR, including the security situation, the priority political elements as defined above regarding the political process, including the electoral process and other issues as set out in paragraph 9 and 12 of this resolution, and the implementation of the Peace Agreement, progress on mechanisms and capacity to advance governance and fiscal management, and relevant information on the progress, promotion and protection of human rights and international humanitarian law and on the protection of civilians; the status of the implementation of MINUSCA's mandated tasks, including support to non-United Nations security forces in strict compliance with the HRDDP, including by providing appropriate financial information; force and police generation and deployment of all MINUSCA's constituent elements, and information on the progress in the implementation of the measures taken to improve MINUSCA's performance, including measures to ensure force effectiveness as outlined in paragraphs 34 to 42, as well as information on the implementation of the zero-tolerance policy on sexual exploitation and abuse as outlined in paragraph 41;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in June 2021.

CAR: France to report to SC on implementation of mandate to support MINUSCA

Resolution 2552 (2020) of 12 November 2020

Para. 52: Authorises French armed forces, within the provisions of their existing bilateral agreement with the CAR and the limits of their capacities and areas of deployment, at the request of the Secretary-General, to use all the means to provide operational support to elements of MINUSCA when under serious threat, from the date of adoption of this resolution, and requests France to ensure reporting to the Council on the implementation of this mandate and to coordinate its reporting with that of the Secretary-General referred to in paragraph 54 of this resolution;

CAR: Sanctions: SG to conduct assessment on progress achieved by CAR on the key benchmarks

Resolution 2536 (2020) of 28 July 2020

Para. 13: Requests the Secretary-General, in close consultation with MINUSCA, including UNMAS, and the Panel of Experts, to conduct, no later than 15 June 2021, an assessment on the progress achieved by the CAR authorities on the key benchmarks;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in June 2021.

CAR: Sanctions: Panel of experts midterm and final reports

Resolution 2536 (2020) of 28 July 2020

Para. 7: Requests the Panel of Experts to provide to the Council, after discussion with the Committee, a midterm report no later than 31 January 2021, a final report no later than 30 June 2021, and progress updates, as appropriate;

The PoE final report is expected to be provided no later than 30 June 2021.

Mali: MINUSMA mandate

Resolution 2531 (2020) of 29 June 2020

Para. 16: Decides to extend the mandate of MINUSMA until 30 June 2021;

The mandate will expire on 30 June 2021.

Mali: SG reports on MINUSMA on the implementation of resolution 2531 (2020)

Resolution 2531 (2020) of 29 June 2020

Para. 62: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every three months after the adoption of this resolution on the implementation of this resolution, focusing: (i) on progress in the implementation of the Agreement, particularly on the priority measures referenced in paragraph 3 above, (ii) on progress in the implementation of the Stratégie de stabilisation du centre du Mali, particularly on the priority measures referenced in paragraph 14 above, as well as on MINUSMA's efforts to support these objectives, (iii) on coordination, exchange of information and, when applicable, mutual operational and logistical support, between MINUSMA, the MDSF, the FC-G5S, the French Forces and the European Union missions in Mali, (iv) on measures to improve external communication of the mission;

S/PRST/2020/10 of 15 October 2020

Last para.: The Security Council also requests MINUSMA, within its mandate and existing resources, to support the political transition in Mali, particularly by exercising good offices, confidence-building and facilitation at the national and local levels, and by supporting, together with the United Nations country team, the holding of inclusive, free, fair, transparent, and credible elections, conducted in a peaceful environment, including through the provision of technical assistance and security arrangements, consistent with the provisions of the Agreement. It requests the Secretary General to include in its quarterly reports on MINUSMA's work in Mali the following information:

Mali: SG letter on MINUSMA operations, performance and implementation of the integrated strategic framework

Resolution [2531 \(2020\)](#) of 29 June 2020

Para. 63: Further requests the Secretary-General, addressing perspectives from all relevant actors, including the SRSG, in consultation with the Force Commander, to provide every six months the Security Council with a letter exclusively and thoroughly focusing on: (i) information on progress in mission operations, to include security challenges, implementation of the adaptation plan as well as an update on discussions in the Instance de Coordination au Mali on the coordination of security responsibilities, (ii) information on performance and rotations of uniformed personnel, on the basis of the methodology referred to in paragraph 49, including information on undeclared caveats and their impact on the mission, and how the reported cases of under-

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian Question: SG to report to the Council on the implementation of resolution [2334 \(2016\)](#)

Resolution [2334 \(2016\)](#) of 23 December 2016

Para. 12: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every three months on the implementation of the provisions of the present resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in June 2021.

Middle East (Syria): OPCW DG to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#)

Resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#) of 27 September 2013

Para.12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall

Middle East (UNDOF): SG reports on developments in the situation and measures taken to implement resolution 338 (1973)

Resolution 2555 (2020) of 18 December 2020

Para. 16: Requests the Secretary-General to report every 90 days on developments in the situation and the measures taken to implement resolution 338 (1973).

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in June 2021.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution 2534 (2020) and resolution 2451 (2018)

Resolution 2534 (2020) of 14 July 2020

Para. 7: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, including on any obstructions to the effective operation of UNMHA caused by any party; and on resolution 2451 (2018), including on any non-compliance by any party;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in June 2021.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to present to SC further review of UNMHA

Resolution 2534 (2020) of 14 July 2020

Para. 8: Further requests the Secretary-General to present to the Council a further review of UNMHA, at least one month before UNMHA's mandate is due to expire;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in June 2021.

COUNTER TERRORISM/NON-PROLIFERATION

Non-proliferation (Iran): SG reports on the implementation of resolution 2231 (2015)

Note by the PSC of 16 January 2016

Para. 7: The Security Council requests that the Secretary-General report to the Security Council every six months on the implementation of resolution 2231 (2015). Prior to the public release of that report, the Security Council shall meet informally, normally at the expert level, to review the findings and recommendations contained in the report.

Facilitator's proposal as agreed on 17 March 2017

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in June 2021.

Non-proliferation (Iran): Joint Commission reports

Resolution 2231 (2015) of 20 July 2015

JCPOA Annex IV – Joint Commission para. 6.10.: The Joint Commission will report to the United Nations Security Council at least every 6 months on the status of the Procurement Working Group's decisions and on any implementation issues.

Facilitator's proposal as agreed on 17 March 2017

The Joint Commission is expected to report in June 2021.

Non-proliferation (Iran): Facilitator to brief the other members of the SC

Note by the PSC of 16 January 2016

Para. 3: To facilitate its work under resolution 2231 (2015), the Security Council shall select on an annual basis one member to serve as its facilitator for the functions specified in the present note. The facilitator shall brief the other members of the Council on its work and the implementation of the

resolution every six months, in parallel with the report submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with paragraph 7 below.

Facilitator's proposal as agreed on 17 March 2017

The Facilitator is expected to brief in June 2021.

OTHER

Children and armed conflict: SG annual report to SC

Resolution [2225 \(2015\)](#) of 18 June 2015

Para. 18: Reiterates its requests to the Secretary-General to continue to submit comprehensive annual reports to the Council on the implementation of its resolutions and Presidential statements on children and armed conflict and to ensure that in all his reports on country-specific situations the matter of children and armed conflict is included as specific aspect of the report;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in June 2021.

Residual mechanism: Progress reports

Resolution [1966 \(2010\)](#) of 22 December 2010

Para. 16: Requests the President of the Mechanism to submit an annual report to the Security Council and to the General Assembly, and the President and the Prosecutor of the Mechanism to submit six-monthly reports to the Security Council on the progress of the work of the Mechanism;

Resolution [2529 \(2020\)](#) of 25 June 2020

Para. 10: Reiterates its request to the Mechanism to include in its six-monthly reports to the Council information on progress achieved in implementing this resolution, as well as detailed information on the staffing of the Mechanism, respective workload and related costs with breakdown by division and detailed projections of the duration of residual functions based on available data;

The progress report dated 20 May 2021 ([S/2021/487](#)) is before the Security Council.
