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I& PURPOSE

This guidance applies to the management of human remains of United Nations personnel ho ha!e died during a pandemic situation, hether suspected or confirmed to "e due to the pandemic#related infection or "ecause of other circumstances\$

ensuring that families recei!e medical certificates of death, "urial permits, autops; reports and other rele!ant documentation to resol!e financial and estate issue\$

7ased on the findings of the assessment on options and capacit; a!aila"le locall;, arrangements ith local pro!iders should "e made and agreements put in place as earl; as possi"le if the facilities and ser!ices of these pro!iders are a!aila"le and deemed suita"le, including sufficient capacit; in case of higher demand\$

In situations here local capacit; is una!aila"le or insufficient to respond to potentiall; higher demand, an assessment should "e made as earl; as possi"le regarding the need to secure temporar; refrigeration e>uipment or other supplies/chemicals as re>uired, including "od; "ags, coffins, and hermeticall; sealed cas=ets\$

VI& ADDITIONAL RE (UIREMENTS FOR HANDLING OF REMAINS

In all cases of death of United Nations personnel, here!er possi"le, a diagnostic test for pandemic infection, including / +11, should "e carried out on the remains as soon as possi"le ?unless the indi!idual as tested positi!e prior to the death®, or an appropriate s a" ta=en and preser!ed until testing is possi"le\$

A presence of infection should "e ta=en into account in determining the cause of death\$, or the handling of an; remains, the presence of pandemic infection, including / +11, or other infectious disease should "e assumed until =no n other ise\$

In cases of death at a more remote location, appropriation arrangements are to "e made, including United Nations "od; e!acuation ?7+&'1A/® transport modalities here re>uired, to relocate the remains as soon as possi"le to a more central dut; station here proper handling, potential storage, and international transportation or disposal of remains ?"urial or cremation® are more li=el; to "e possi"le\$

After remains are remo!ed, cleaning and disinfection procedures should "e follo ed in the same a; as for a room that had a li!e / +1I or similarl; infectious patient\$
