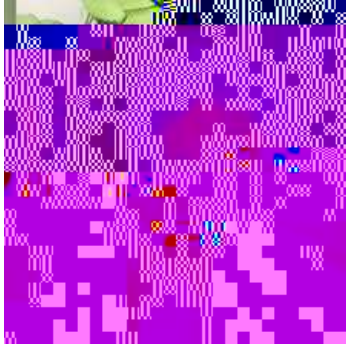

Izabella Teixeira is a member of the UN High Level Advisory Board on Economic and Social Affairs, Trustee Emeritus at the Brazilian Center of International Relations (CEBR), and former Minister of Environment for Brazil (2010-2016). She is also Co-Chair of the International Resource Panel of the UN Environment (IRP/UNEP) and of the Administrative Council of The Brazilian Development Bank (BNDES).

Throughout her career, Ms. Teixeira held different administrative positions in the Ministry of Environment, in the Rio de Janeiro State Government and in IBAMA, where she joined in 1984. She played a key role in the negotiation of the Paris Agreement and was appointed, in 2012, to serve on the High Level Panel of Eminent Persons for the Post-2015 Development Agenda.

In 2013, she won the UN Environment's "Champions of the Earth" Global Award for her contribution to reducing deforestation in the Amazon. She holds a Master's degree in Energy Planning and a PhD in Environmental Planning from COPPE/UFRI.
