

This first iteration of the Global Youth Policy Paper for Summit of the Future draws together these ideas and inputs - and also builds on our SDG Summit



We acknowledge the significance of youth within the UN system and underwrite the recommendations of promoting meaningful, inclusive, and effective engagement of youth, youth-led and youth-focused organizations in the work of the United Nations as well as the proposal of negotiating the Declaration on Future Generations intergovernmentally, with the possibility of annexing the Declaration to the Pact for the Future.
