since the previous quarterly briefing, held in January.

Since its emergence in early 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic has continued to present considerable ongoing and evolving challenges for Member States.

CTED has continued to be at the forefront of monitoring and assessing the impacts of the pandemic on terrorism, counter-terrorism, and countering violent extremism.

Despite the progress in vaccinations made by some Member States, outbreaks continue, and the pandemic remains a global threat.

Despite fears of increasing terrorism and radicalization to violence, it is still too early to comprehensively assess the impacts of the pandemic on terrorism and counterterrorism.

A CTED analytical report to be published in June 2021 will present the latest evidence-based research on the impacts of the pandemic, drawn from our close collaboration with partners in Member States, UN agencies, civil society, and the private sector.
